Congratulations on making it through a historic election! Warren County has broken several records - such as a record number of registered voters. Since the Primary Election, we added 8,500 new voters, bringing us to 167,624.

Another record broken - highest turnout election our county has ever had, at over 80%. Even though most of the turnout was at our office during early voting and by mail, we still realize that the polling locations were busy at peak times. This high turnout during early voting undoubtedly helped all our polling locations by reducing the number of voters processed. We are proud of all our Board staff and our Precinct Election Officials for helping make this election so successful for Warren County.

We realize our electronic poll books are at the end of their life, and in 2021 we will be looking at purchasing all new equipment. We will also be looking at expanding our new online PEO training and possibly training workers for specific tasks at the locations.  - The first polling locations to report back to the BOE on Election Night were Countryside YMCA,

 Pure Ministries, and Turtlecreek Township Admin Building at 8:27 p.m.
 - Our last location reported back at 9:45 p.m.

Precinct 178 - 59 voters (6.20%)

Busiest Precincts

Precinct 193 - 447 voters (52.22%)

Precinct 189 - 322 voters (49.31%)

Project Search


At the start of autumn, the Board of Elections began working with Project Search, a program that places students and recent graduates with disabilities into internship positions. Through the program, we were able to work with twelve interns who assisted us on many levels to cover the election workload. Students including Haley Marion, Jacob Russell, and Evan Holt took care of clerical duties such as shredding, cleaning, and sorting, among other responsibilities. In addition to putting credit toward their internships, the program also allows the interns to have paid work while their usual employment is closed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
