How Many Voters?

There were <u>72,043</u> ballots cast in total.

Voter turnout was 41.9%.

Registered voters: 172,104.

Voting Breakdown

Provisional Votes: 747.

Election Day Votes: 52,882.

Early Voting Votes: 13,814.







Visual learning can help people process information faster and more easily. For this election, we created some visual aids to help pollworkers with processing voters and handling voting equipment after the polls close. This included diagrams for the e-pollbook case and blue voted ballot bag, as well as a step-by-step script for assisting voters at the polls.









There are many elements of the election process that could be helpful if illustrated, so we will add more visual guides to the workbook as needed. Keep an eye out as we move forward to November!

Did You Know?

While you face some of the anger over polling locations moving to new buildings - be assured, moving a polling location is one of the most difficult decisions we have to make at the Board of Elections. We never move locations without giving considerable thought to how it will affect voters and doing our best to notify each voter in the affected precinct. We are **required by law** to send cards to each registered voter alerting them of the polling location change. Many voters in the affected precinct will say they didn't get the notification, but we can show from their record that a bright yellow card was sent to them. We also post signs at old locations in order to direct voters on Election Day.

The reasons for why we have to move voters to a new location is always available on our website or by calling us. Reasons include: location asking us to leave, precinct size gets too big for location, ADA requirements.
